

My association with Manly Dragons started in early 2014 when Ross Boyce approached me to become a sponsor. I was truly honoured to be asked as I was already aware of the Club and had watched with interest as the dragon boats were training along the front channel of the marinas.

Those nights are my earliest recollections and while I wasn't a part of the Club at that time, I was made to feel a part of it and as my life's circumstances changed, the opportunity presented itself for me to attend the Club Crew World Championships in Szeged Hungary.

In July 2018, 57 paddlers and a support crew of 15 from the Manly Dragon Boat Club travelled to contest the 11th Club Crew World Championships. This culminated two years of preparation for the crew who were joined by 6200 athletes from 140 clubs across 32 different countries.

This was the largest dragon boat regatta to be conducted anywhere and the competition was fierce. Manly Dragons contested 15 categories and the crews made the minor or major final in each one, bringing home Gold, Silver and

The Club was the top ranked Australian Club at the competition and ranked 17th in the world. As a matter of interest, in the top 17 clubs, there was 1 Australian, 1 American, 2 Hungarian and 13 Canadian Clubs and that record stands today until the next Club Crew World Championships in 2022.

My whole world changed attending that event as I was able to experience Manly Dragons in action, watching them compete on the water and as a club working together, their relationships with each other and also with me and I felt included even though I had never lifted a paddle.

This was my grounding in understanding the incredible culture of Manly Dragons that produces world champions and good buddies. Their guiding principles and character with qualities of acceptance, inclusiveness and respect have created a wonderful club to be a part of.

Along with striving to represent their community at competition, they also strive for a balance to ensure that the paddling needs of all members are catered for. The balance of performance focus and personal inclusiveness in competing is a significant part of Manly Dragon Culture.

I became a member on my return and can only encourage everyone to Come & Try as a new world of fun, exercise and health will open up and with State, National and International regattas ... you can enjoy travel with buddies and friends to lots of places if you choose to participate!!!

I would like to welcome you to the President's 2nd AGM report.

For those of you that are not familiar with this Club's origins it dates back to July 2005 when Phil Rallings from Currumbin Dragon Boat Club first made attempts to establish a Manly based dragon boat club via the Chamber of Commerce. In August 2006, and as a new member of the Chamber of Commerce, I was asked if I knew anything about Dragon Boats. The answer to that was NO but I was willing to find out more. In July 2006 I placed an ad in the local paper and on notice boards throughout Manly -Wynnum - Lota and held our very first meeting at the Wynnum Manly Yacht Club on 15th September 2006 with 17 people in attendance. Phil and Faye Rallings spoke to us about how to start up a new club, explaining the costs and what was involved. Three further meetings were held to get the ball rolling until we held our first official Manly Dragon Boat Club meeting in January 2007. By then we had almost 30 financial members.

This year we have continued to train hard and improve on our fitness, paddling prowess and our standing in the competitive arena. For such a young club, it was a fantastic effort to see eight ladies from Manly selected to be part of the Queensland team at the National Championships held in March 2009. Elizabeth and Pat endured a long and arduous training and selection process to be chosen in the Grand Masters Womens team. Maggie, Jill, Carmen, Chris, Fran and Heather were selected for the Masters Women team and received a bronze medal after some very close racing against New South Wales and a second Queensland team.

This was a fantastic result for an enthusiastic crew. Manly aims to improve on this performance with plans well under way to send a Club team to Adelaide for the Australian Championships in April 2010. A number of the ladies will back up to try out for the State team again and rumour has it that a few of the men will give it a go this time.



We have purchased another two new Champion Dragon Boats funded by a grant from the Gambling Community Benefit Fund and have received funding from the Department of Communities - Sport and Recreation for club development; and successfully competed in the last two seasons of state regattas.

We also entered teams at a number of local regattas held over the past 12 months.

We have hosted community programs during the year including a visit from 35 enthusiastic young ladies from CANTEEN who joined us for a morning on the water in April. The Brisbane City Council sponsored Real Action Women (RAW) day that enabled over 20 ladies to come and try out the sport, and this has led to a greater interest in joining the Club.

Manly Dragons came first place in a major final in the Senior B Mixed at the BRD Regatta.







December 2011 marked the 5 year anniversary of the formation boats and a RIB rescue boat.






Continuing this fine tradition in Brisbane's bayside community, the Manly Dragon Boat Club is now seven years old and continues to enjoy great success. Currently we have a membership of 90.

During this year, we have continued to train hard and improve on our fitness, paddling prowess and our standing in the competitive arena. In April this year, we travelled to Penrith to the Sydney International Regatta Centre with high hopes of performing well at the 2013 Australian Dragon Boat Championships. At the end of the regatta, we came away with 11 Australian Championship titles. Manly Dragon Boat Club is now ranked #2 in Australia in the Masters category.



As a result of this outstanding performance, six of our teams have been invited to Ravenna, Italy to contest the Club Crew World Championships in September 2014.

Also on the international stage, we have seen the selection of 14 of our members to the Auroras the Australian Dragon Boat team. In July, this team travelled to Szeged, Hungary to compete in the World Dragon Boat Championships. A stunning achievement for such a new club.

We had our first marine incident earlier this year when one of our crews was submerged by the huge wash pushed up by a large charter vessel as she approached the entrance of Manly Boat Harbour at full speed. Our safety procedures sprang into action and all paddlers were quickly accounted for. The call for assistance to Coast Guard Brisbane saw the dispatch of a rescue vessel which quickly managed the situation.

A review of our procedures showed no deficiency and in retrospect, it was seen as a good exercise to put our safety standards into practice.

A new management team was elected into office at our AGM held in late August. A huge thank you must go to Jason Ferrari and his team as the outgoing management committee for the fantastic effort they put in over the past couple of years.

As the Club grows in size and performance, the load on committee members continues to increase. So much so, that in recognition of the extensive

role that coaching plays in the development of the paddling performance of the Club, a coaching team has been appointed.

The Club is truly fortunate to have a number of skilled members who are willing and able to contribute to the safe and effective development of the Club and

In the past twelve months, we have applied for another grant from the Gambling Community Benefit Fund to purchase an equipment trailer to transport the growing list of equipment we need when attending regattas.

Manly have again returned from the Club Crew World Championships with a gold medal. Our magnificent Senior B Womens crew conquered the world to win the 2km event. They also placed 2nd in the 200m and 3rd in the 500m. Champions at the pinnacle of a major international sport!

In July 2018, 57 paddlers and a support crew of 15 from the Manly Dragon Boat Club travelled to Szeged Hungary to contest the 11th Club Crew World Championships. This culminated two years of preparation for the crew who were joined by 6200 athletes from 140 clubs across 32 different countries. This was the largest dragon boat regatta to be conducted anywhere and the competition was fierce. Manly Dragons can hold their heads high as in each of the 15 categories contested, the crews made the minor or major final, bringing home Gold, Silver and Bronze medals.

The Club was the top ranked Australian Club at the competition and ranked 17th in the world. As a matter of interest, in the top 17 clubs, there was 1 Australian, 1 American, 2 Hungarian and 13 Canadian clubs and that record stands today until the next Club Crew World Championship in 2022.

The impressive performance by our Senior B (50+) Women saw them take out a BRONZE medal in the 500m large boat division and a Club Crew World Championship GOLD medal in the 200m large boat division. The Senior B ladies capped off the competition by winning a SILVER medal with the men in the large boat 200m mixed crew division. Congratulations to the Premier Womens 10s who participated at CCWC for the first time and made it to the finals for 500m placing 7th. This campaign was the most successful, medalling in 13 events out of 18

Congratulations to the coaching team led by Mike Martin. The execution of their training program leading up to this event was conducted superbly. The discipline and cohesiveness demonstrated by the crew is testament to the preparation delivered by the coaching crew.
















It is an exciting season ahead for the Manly Family and time to plan what you wish to believe and achieve!
